Description:

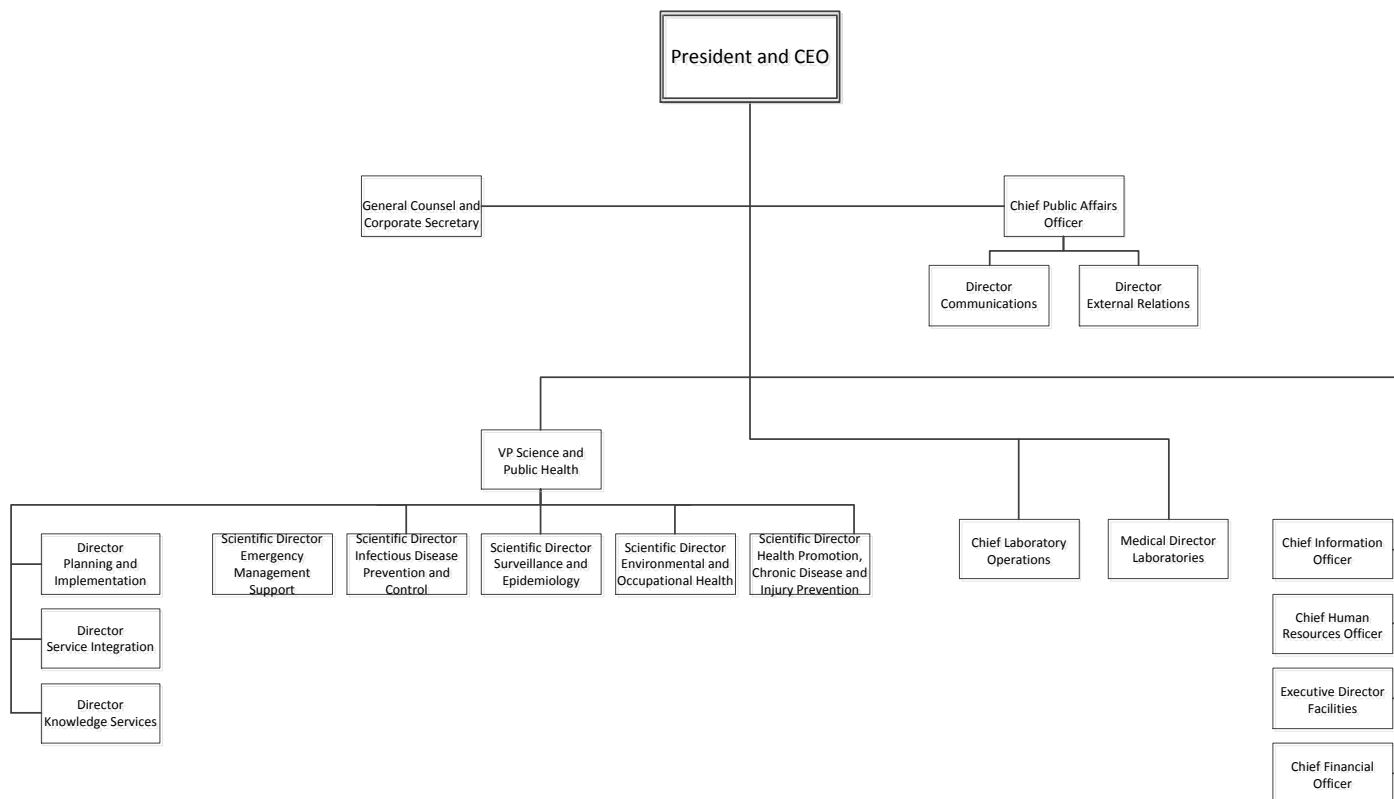

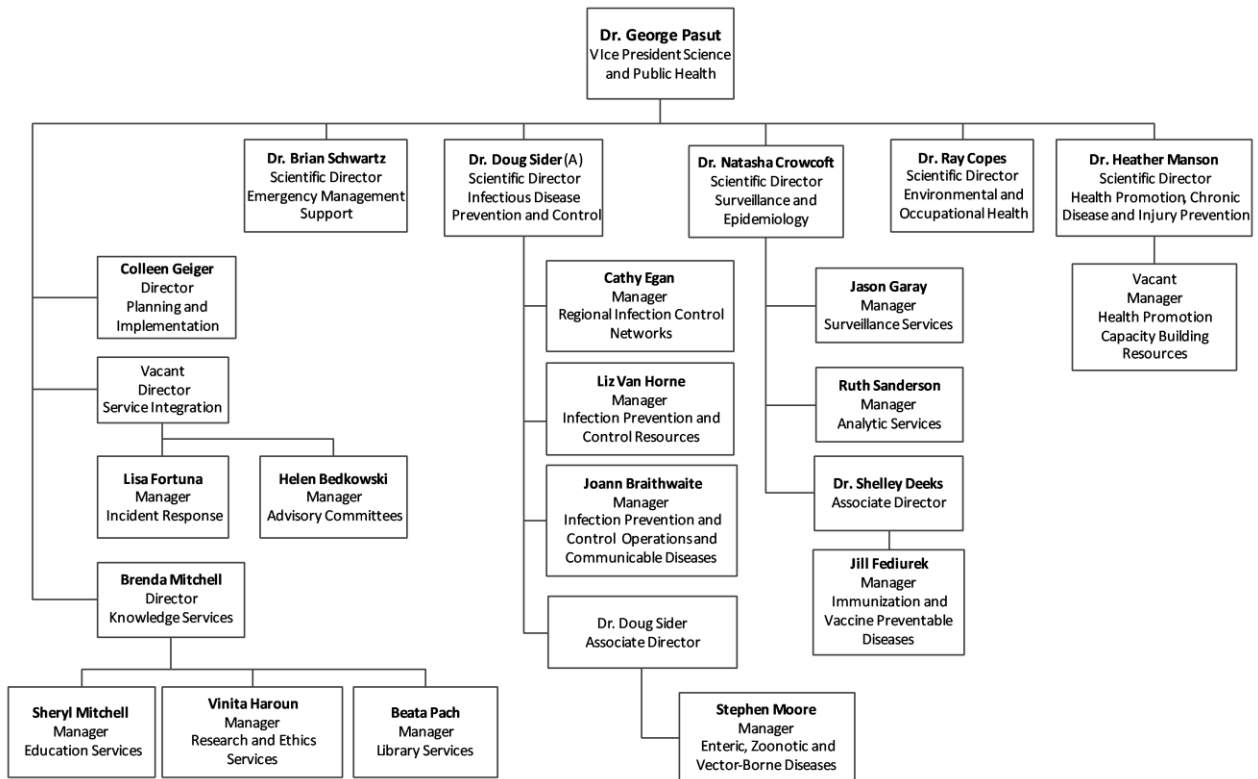

Infectious disease prevention and control

Description:

Infectious Disease Prevention and Control (IDP&C) is responsible for the development, implementation and evaluation of comprehensive and integrated strategies/programs for the prevention and control of infectious diseases, with a primary focus on healthcare-associated infections (HAI) and infections of public health importance. To do so, IDP&C works closely with other program areas within Public Health Ontario (PHO), especially Surveillance & Epidemiology, Environment & Occupational Health, Knowledge Services, Public Health Laboratories and Emergency Management Support. IDP&C embraces the core functions of PHO, especially the provision of policy guidance, development of evidence-informed guidelines, research/evaluation, education, field support and strengthening of central/field capacity. IDP&C has grown substantially since the founding of PHO, especially with the recent transfer of staff and functions from the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care's (MOHLTC) Public Health Division, and now comprises the following roles/functions:

- Regional Infection Control Networks, the province-wide infrastructure of infection prevention and control serving acute/long-term care, community-based health services, public health and emergency medical services and based on the existing Local Health Integration Network geography;
- Provincial responsibility, through our IP&C Resources Program, for the development, implementation and evaluation of IP&C Core Competencies, the provincial Just Clean Your Hands Program and the Antibiotic Resistant Organism Program;
- Support for healthcare institutions addressing IP&C planning and challenges, especially as these relate to HAIs, through consultant support (especially via Infection Control Resource Teams), research, evaluation and education;
- Provincial consultant support, outbreak coordination, research/evaluation and education addressing enteric, zoonotic, vector-borne and other public health communicable diseases, especially tuberculosis, sexually-transmitted infections, blood-borne infections, respiratory infections/outbreaks and emerging infectious diseases;
- Scientific/technical support to the Provincial Infectious Diseases Advisory Committee Advisory Committees on Infection Prevention and Control and Communicable Diseases;
- Support for MOHLTC planning priorities such as the ever-greening of Ontario Public Health Standards, Protocols and Guidance Documents as well as the Ontario Health Plan for an Influenza Pandemic.

Description:

Regional Infection Control Networks (RICNs) coordinate infection prevention and control (IPAC) activities and promote standardization in health care facilities across Ontario. RICNs maximize integration and enhance communication among all health care professionals in the province who have a vested interest in IPAC. The RICNs facilitate knowledge transfer and information sharing in order to enhance patient safety, reduce duplication of effort and ensure that scarce resources are used efficiently. RICNs also provide members with continuing education and access to a wealth of expertise. There are fourteen individual RICNs in Ontario to assist health care providers across the continuum of care achieve best practices in infection prevention and control.

Surveillance and epidemiology

Description:

Surveillance and epidemiology is responsible for the surveillance and outbreak detection to support public health systems in Ontario. This includes support for public health units, various ministries of the Ontario government and other partners for health. The program leads the collection, data management, analysis, interpretation and dissemination of public health data. The program comprises technical experts in surveillance, epidemiology, biostatistics, health economics and geospatial analysis.

Frequently received inquiries relate reportable disease surveillance including requests for data, information and/or interpretation; immunization issues and general assistance with outbreak management of vaccine preventable diseases; epidemiologic assistance with local outbreak investigations; epidemiologic analysis of public health indicators including chronic disease prevention, prevention of injury and substance misuse, reproductive health and child health.

Environmental and occupational health

Description:

Environmental and occupational health provides scientific advice and field support with respect to a variety of existing and emerging environmental health issues such as indoor air quality, ambient air pollution, and water quality. The program's multi-disciplinary team works with and supports public health units and policy makers to better respond to an increasing array of concerns through the provision of evidence-based reviews, research, training workshops, and access to environmental monitoring equipment. Close collaboration with public health partners, academic institutions and others are underway to build on past experiences and move forward in this critical area to further support evidence-based decision making in public health.

Health promotion capacity building resources

Description:

Public Health Ontario's health promotion resource centres deliver services aimed at building the health promotion capacity of Ontario's public health workforce. Specifically, resource centres provide training, consultations, print and electronic resources, knowledge exchange events, network building opportunities and referrals to practitioners in public health units, community health centres, health related non-governmental organizations (e.g., Canadian Cancer Society), issue-specific networks and other organizations addressing health promotion, chronic disease and injury prevention. Health promotion resource centres include:

Ontario Injury Prevention Resource Centre (OIPRC) – Housed at SMARTRISK, OIPRC enhances the capacity of public health injury prevention practitioners and their community partners to implement comprehensive, multi-risk factor injury prevention programs through resource development, support for front-line public health staff and training.

The Health Communication Unit (THCU) – Housed at Public Health Ontario, THCU provides health promotion practitioners with provincial and regional workshops, tailored consultations and print and electronic resource materials addressing key health promotion skill areas including planning, health communication, policy development, evaluation and sustainability.

Program Training and Consultation Centre (PTCC) – Housed at Cancer Care Ontario, PTCC is the lead and coordinating resource centre for the Smoke-Free Ontario strategy and is responsible for providing training, technical assistance and resources to health professionals working in tobacco control in Ontario.

Alcohol Policy Network (APN) – Housed at the Ontario Public Health Organization, APN supports the development, implementation, assessment and coordination of multi-level (school, college/university, workplace, municipal, provincial and national) alcohol policies and guides alcohol policy related decisions through training, technical assistance, resources and knowledge exchange initiatives.
